

Contemporary living soars Reem Island's completed project's occupancy to 65%

Reem Island's impressive model to be showcased at Cityscape Abu Dhabi

Abu Dhabi in 15 April 2013- Bunya, Reem Island's regulatory authority established by master developers Tamouh, Sorouh Real Estate and Reem Investments , announced today that the occupancy of Marina Square and Sun and Sky Towers has reached a remarkable 65%. The island's residential offerings and offices will be showcased at this year's Cityscape Abu Dhabi from the 16th to the 18th April.

Located to the northeast of Abu Dhabi less than a kilometre away from downtown and a mere 20 minutes from the capital's international airport, this 887-hectare development offers far more than simply residential units and offices. Linked to Abu Dhabi via eight bridges, out of which two are currently used, the island is designed with high-end contemporary living in mind.

Featuring lush, verdant parkland and invigorating pedestrian walkways, the purpose is to promote outdoor lifestyle possibilities for residents. Sultan continued, 'As well as the promise of a relaxing and safe quality of life, Reem Island takes environmental consciousness to new heights.'

While Sorouh's Boutik Mall is already open and accommodates its visitors' dining, shopping and leisure needs, there are several entertainment facilities still under construction such as Marina Square's Paragon Bay Mall. Set around a beautiful marina overlooking downtown Abu Dhabi, Paragon Bay will be adding new dining outlets and coffee shops to the capital, in addition to a seven-screen Cineplex.

Upon completion of all planned phases, the island will be home to 200,000 residents. Eleven private schools with a capacity for 22,000 students, not to mention the internationally acclaimed Paris-Sorbonne University, which was inaugurated in 2011 and brings world-class higher education to Abu Dhabi. Mosques, retail malls, recreation centers, beaches and an array of dining options complete the impressive picture.
